

# MEET THE COUNSELORS

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#### PROMOTION REQUIREMENTS

- Promotion to 10th Grade Five credits on transcript. One credit must be EITHER English I/Technical Writing 9 OR Algebra I/Math Essentials.
- Promotion to 11th Grade Eleven credits on transcript. Four of which must be core subjects including BOTH Algebra I AND English I.
- Promotion to 12th Grade Eighteen credits on transcript. Four of which must be core subjects including BOTH Algebra I AND English I.

# MIDDLE SCHOOL CREDITS

- ■Upon entering high school, a majority of our students have earned a high school credit(s) in middle school. Some examples are as follows:

# IGP (INDIVIDUAL GRADUATION PLAN)

- An IGP is an outline of students' courses from the 8th grade through the 12th grade.
- ■Students will meet with their counselors to plan for future courses needed to meet their graduation requirements.
- ■IGPs are sent home for parent signatures and should be returned to their counselors.

### **LEAP 2025**

■The LEAP 2025 exam is given at the end of particular courses as part of the course and graduation requirements. Students must pass one of the two exams in each set as part of their graduation requirements. These test grades are also figured into the students' final grade for that course.

# LEAP 2025 Requirements by Grade Level

- ■Current 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade students:
  - ■English I or English II
  - ■Algebra I or Geometry
  - ■Biology I or US History
- Current 9<sup>th</sup> grade students:
  - English I or English II
  - Algebra I or Geometry
  - Biology I or Civics

### **GEOMETRY**

■Beginning with the freshman class of 2023-2024 and any student classified as T9 (transitional 9th grader) in 2022-2023, the Louisiana Department of Education (LDOE) is requiring ALL students to take geometry regardless of their chosen diploma track.

#### 2 TYPES OF HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMAS

- **■**TOPS University
  - Prepares students to immediately enroll in a 4-year college/university (i.e. Nicholls, Southeastern, LSU, Grambling, ULL)

Testing Requirements		

1. LEAP2025 – Students must pass with at least an Approaching Basic.

2. All students MUST have an ACT score on file to be eligible to walk across the stage for graduation.

#### 2 TYPES OF HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMAS

- ■Jump Start Career
  - Prepares students to immediately start at a 2-year college or technical school (i.e. Fletcher, Delgado, Baton Rouge Community College, Young Memorial)
- ■The following slide is an overview of the courses required for the Jump Start diploma track.
